




The perceived levels of public sector corruption in 180 countries/territories around the world.







Despite these investments, security continued to worsen. As the mission slowly shifted away from counterterrorism toward reconstruction-heavy counterinsurgency, U.S. officials added a nebulous new enemy to the list. As Ambassador Ryan Crocker told SIGAR, "The ultimate point of failure for our efforts wasn't an insurgency. It was the weight of endemic corruption."65 It became increasingly apparent that Afghan officials themselves were corrupting reconstruction efforts, exacerbating conflict, and driving





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Corrupt capital flows

The Financial Secrecy Index

The Financial Secrecy Index ranks countries based on how much financial secrecy they supply to the world. A higher rank on the index does not necessarily mean a country is more secretive, but that the country plays a bigger role in enabling wealthy individuals and criminals to hide and launder money extracted from around the world.

The index is published once every two years.

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Londongrad

- Clearing house and destination for corrupt capital
- Considered high-risk by US authorities
- Successive UK governments ambivalent about acting
- New focus since Ukraine
 - Unexplained wealth orders
 - Magnitsky sanctions
 - Beneficial ownership transparency
 - Reform of Overseas Territories & Crown Dependencies
 - Focus on professional enablers

What does it mean for companies and markets?


- Corruption leads to uncertainty and political instability
